Dear Friends,

I imagined, like all of you, that I wouldn't be writing the editorial for this month's edition of the Messenger! Unfortunately a new incumbent wasn't appointed in November, but the good news is that the advert is now live again on the Pathways website (link below):

Meanwhile, we continue to thrive as a parish, thanks mainly to our volunteers and office holders, and of course, to you our wonderful parishioners, for supporting them and remaining steadfast in your faith and attendance. I am sure the reason is...prayer.

Prayer is at the heart of every church and Christian person, and by the time you read this magazine, we will be in the second week of Lent, which is the most intense period of prayer in the calendar. It is a time of reflection, to take stock of our lives, to examine ourselves in the light of the sacrifice that Jesus made on the Cross for our sins.

In Lent, we are called to do several things. Prayer; alongside prayer is the need for Repentance, not simply to say or feel sorry, but to actively turn away from sin and toward the light of Christ. Then Fasting, or as most people say, giving something up for Lent.

However, the intention should be 'Spiritual Focus' not using Lent as an excuse to give up smoking or sweets! (I'm guilty of that one.) Fasting is not just about giving up food either; it is a spiritual discipline aimed at drawing closer to God. To summarise; we are encouraged to use this time of Lent for:

- Prayer: Increased prayer and meditation on Scripture.
- Repentance: be genuine in being sorry and seek forgiveness
- Fasting: to abstain from things that make us weak or selfish

- Charity: Engaging in acts of kindness and charity, reflecting the teachings of Jesus.
- Community: Participating in church services and community activities to strengthen faith and fellowship.

Lent is a time for all the above; but not forgetting preparation for the celebration of Easter. The discipline of Lent emphasizes the importance of turning away from distractions to focus on one's relationship with God.

All that remains is for me to pray that your Lent will be personally refreshing and meaningful; and that we all pray unceasingly that God will send the right person to be our vicar. Thank you and God Bless all of you.

## **LENT LUNCH 2026**

This year's Lent Lunch will be held on Sunday 8th March after coffee. Please join us to enjoy a bowl of delicious homemade soup and a roll in exchange for a donation to charity. It was lovely to have so many attend last year for food and fellowship and we hope for a good turnout again this year to support our chosen charity, SVP Chorley Buddies.

SVP CHORLEY BUDDIES SVP Chorley Buddies is a very active St Vincent de Paul Society community support project working throughout Chorley Borough. It exists to respond to identified need in the community, relieve social isolation and combat food and financial poverty. The charity works in partnership with Chorley Council and

other local organisations such as Living Waters Storehouse, Help the Homeless and Chorley Women's Centre.

To this end three staff and 100 enthusiastic volunteers offer food clubs, telephone befriending, delivery of food parcels and social and leisure activities. Individual families in need are also offered support with furniture, clothing or household items. The school uniform events which run during the year are extremely popular giving parents access to donated uniforms for local primary and secondary schools.

The four weekly food clubs operate in two areas of Chorley plus Coppull and Clayton Brook. At very low cost shoppers have access to good quality food, toiletries and other items which would otherwise end up in landfill. Most of the food comes from FareShare and from individual businesses. Over 1000 people are helped every month and membership is open to anyone. The sessions also offer a chance for people to meet and socialise in a safe space which has proved very popular. There is even an emporium stall with good quality clothes, accessories, toys and bric a brac at very reasonable prices.

A community café is held every Wednesday morning in the Buttermere Community Centre where all are invited to come along to a warm space with an equally warm welcome. After lunch a weekly craft club operates at a very modest cost.

Two lunch socials with entertainment or an activity session are held each month enabling people to get out of the house and into company. There is no charge made but donations are always welcome.

Leisure activity classes are provided at various places in the Borough including seated yoga and chair exercise, aquarobics, knit and knatter and children's crafts. In the school holidays children's activity sessions prove very popular with local families in Chorley and Clayton Brook.

The charity is also involved in seasonal events such as the Christmas Toy Appeal when hundreds of children receive new toys donated by generous local individuals and organisations.

# Spotlight on Safeguarding

This month I am focussing on Safe Spaces:

## Safe Spaces

A free, national support service independently run by Victim Support. It provides a confidential, personal and safe space for anyone who has been abused through their relationship with either The Church of England or The Catholic Church of England and Wales.

Safe Spaces is open, and there are no waiting lists for support. You do not have to have reported the incident to the Church authorities or the Police in order to access support. You do not need to be a current active member of the Church in order to access support.

## What is Church Abuse?

This service is for people who have experienced any kind of abuse – this includes (but is not limited to) sexual violence, inappropriate sexual behaviour, physical abuse, financial abuse or exploitation, psychological abuse (including spiritual abuse), domestic abuse, coercive and controlling behaviour and so-called conversion therapy.

The impact will be different for different people and vary according to the type and extent of the abuse. Assumptions cannot be made that abuse which we might assume to be less serious has had a less damaging impact on someone. There is some evidence that the impact of abuse can be especially severe when the abuse has occurred within the church and has been justified by religious concepts. In particular, survivors can feel betrayed both by the abuser and by God.

Safe Spaces can help survivors to process and understand the impact that any abuse has had on them and those around them.

## Electoral Roll 2026

The Electoral Roll is a legal document, and we are required to follow national church policy in its establishment and subsequent maintenance. This month, before the APCM on April 28th is held, an annual review of the roll will be conducted, and a display notification of the review will appear on March 15th. Revision and preparation of the roll will take place between April 7th and April 11th and be compiled and displayed on April 12th. Some non-residents may not meet the attendance criteria to remain on roll which could lead to non-attenders being removed unless there are mitigating circumstances. The roll will then be published on May 1st.

It is important to remember that not being on the Electoral Roll does not mean that you are not part of our church family, it does however mean that you are not eligible to seek election for certain roles e.g. PCC Member or Synod Member and you are not eligible to vote at the APCM.

You will find the Electoral Roll (Names only version) displayed on the internal notice board of each Parish Church.

## The History Page March 2026 St George's School Origins

With the opening of the National School in November 1825, the companion to the new chapel of ease was in place. By 1844 it had 4 rooms, one teacher and his wife and 67 day pupils.

However, its early life was insecure. The school was dependent on collections, fundraising and the regular subscriptions of Chorley's better-off Anglicans. Attendees were expected to find up to ninepence a week to help defray costs- writing, for example, was charged at tuppence. The schoolmaster's salary was a paltry £40 per year. Notwithstanding this attempt at financial prudence, the debt in 1836 was £69.

There were some heartening factors. The building was also used as a Sunday School and this was in the day when the working families could attend. In 1842, of all ages, there were 506 males and 496 females attending, alongside a remarkable 57 teachers. An extra room opposite the school had to be hired.

Secondly, the Day School began its transition from Chorley's National School to St George's elementary. Once James Streynsham Master had graduated from curate to rector of Chorley, on the death of his absentee uncle, he placed the school firmly under the management of the local clergy, that is the minister of St George's District ( 19th July 1847). All the school needed was an inspirational leader and around 1850 came the arrival of the polymath Thomas Brown. He was to have

### **Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)**

Our APM and APCM will be held on 28th April 2026 at All Saints' Primary School, Moor Road, Chorley, starting at 7:30pm. The APM (normally a very short meeting) will be held first followed by APCM. Both the meetings are major events in the parochial calendar and are conducted in accordance with the requirements as laid out in the Church Representation Rules.

The primary purpose of the APM is to elect the Churchwardens for the parish, in our case we need to elect a total of four, two for each of our parish churches. In addition to those listed on the Church Electoral Roll (referred to as the 'Roll') of the parish, those persons resident in the parish whose names are entered on a register of local government electors by reason of such residence may also attend this meeting.

The purpose of the APCM is to receive reports on changes to the 'Roll', general parish activities, and financial matters. The APCM also elects new members to the PCC, and also to Deanery Synod every three years. This year we are required to elect our new Deanery Synod Representatives. Only persons whose names are listed on the 'Roll' may attend this meeting.

Members of the clergy (including retired clergy) are not legally permitted to have their names listed on a Church Electoral Roll. They are, however, permitted to attend both these meetings.
